Administers the state forensic pathology services program. Provides forensic pathology services and/or forensic pathology consultation to district medical examiners, coroners and deputy coroners upon request. Supervises forensic pathology employees. Performs forensic pathological examinations. Provides court testimony in cases concerning deaths in which forensic pathological examinations have been performed. Provides technical assistance and advice to state and local law enforcement personnel concerning causes of death. Develops technical literature for and delivers scientific presentations to law enforcement, medical examiners, coroners and other medical personnel. Provides consultation to the state laboratory services for anatomical and clinical pathology. Formulates policies and procedures for the state medical examiner program. Prepares and maintains detailed and confidential records and reports.

#### UNIQUE PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Any unique physical requirements necessary to perform the duties of a specific position will be listed on the individual position description, if applicable.

#### TYPICAL WORKING CONDITIONS: Incumbents in the job will typically perform their job duties under these conditions.

Work is performed in a laboratory setting. Incumbent will be exposed to sharp instruments, toxic chemicals and fluids when performing examinations.

#### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

Upon employment, employees in this job classification may be required to maintain a valid driver's license and may be required to drive a licensed vehicle. This status may be necessary for the length of time in this job classification. If this is necessary, it will be listed in the specific position description for the position at issue. Applicants and employees in this job classification may be required to submit to a drug- screening test and background check. Applicants and employees in positions which perform job duties that may require contact with offenders in the custody or supervision of the Department of Corrections or with youth in the care, custody, or supervision of the Department of Juvenile Justice must meet qualifications pursuant to the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act, 28 C.F.R.115.17 and 115.317.
