UNDERSTANDING THE LEGAL AND PRACTICAL DETAILS OF THE NEW EXPUNGEMENT LAW

House Bill 40, by the 2016 General Assembly and signed into law by Gov. Matt Bevin, allows judges to expunge certain low-level felonies if the applicant has abstained from criminal activity for a period of five years. HB 40 also makes important changes to the misdemeanor expungement process.

This program, offered to state attorneys, will cover the new three-step felony expungement process, eligible felonies, and changes to the misdemeanor expungement process.

The program will be presented by Damon Preston, Deputy Public Advocate for the Department of Public Advocacy. Preston is the Deputy Public Advocate for the Department of Public Advocacy. Since being appointed Deputy Public Advocate in 2011, he has focused on DPA's legislative efforts, including expanding expungement opportunities for DPA clients. Since the enactment of HB 40, Damon worked to educate members of the bar on how to best serve clients seeking expungement. In addition to work through DPA, Damon serves on the board of the Kentucky Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers and is a past chair of the Criminal Law Section of the Kentucky Bar Association.
