SUBJECT: Local Option Election in Hardin County, Kentucky

A Local Option Election will be held in Hardin County on **January 8, 2013**, and will include the following precincts:

C101- Highlands	E101- Central
C102- Mantle	E102- Etown East
C103- City Park	E103- Etown North
D101- Freeman	E104- Etown West
D102- Oaklawn	E105- Valley Creek
D103- Pine Valley	E106- Memorial
D104- Helmwood Hgts.	F101- VanMeter

Only those citizens who have registered to vote and who reside in this county shall be entitled to vote in this election.

In accordance with Section 148 of the Kentucky Constitution, KRS 118.035 and the voting leave regulations 101 KAR 2:102, Section 7 and 101 KAR 3:015, Section 7, all employees who are entitled to vote, who are otherwise scheduled to work during the hours that the polls are open, and who request leave in advance shall be granted four (4) hours of voting leave to cast their vote.

Employees voting absentee may be granted this leave if a request is made in advance of the day they appear before the clerk to apply for the absentee ballot, except as noted below. KRS 118.035 states that any qualified voter who exercises their right to voting leave but fails to vote under circumstances that did not prevent them from voting may be subject to disciplinary action. An employee appointed to serve as an Election Officer may receive voting leave not to exceed a total of seven and one-half (7.5) hours (based on a 37.5 hour work week) or eight (8) hours (based on a 40 hour work week) for a designated election to attend training and for service as an Election Officer, provided that such leave is requested and approved in advance.

The voter registration books will reopen on January 15th for the Elizabethtown precincts participating in this election. Please provide us with signature rosters for the above in order to conduct this election.



EXECUTIVE ORDER 2012-007

**DIRECTING LOCAL OPTION ELECTION
PURSUANT TO KRS 242.127 FOR THE
CITY OF ELIZABETHTOWN, KENTUCKY
ON JANUARY 8, 2013**

Comes the duly elected County Judge/Executive of Hardin County, Kentucky, Harry L. Berry, and states that a petition calling for a local option election to allow the sale of distilled spirits and wine by the drink for consumption on the premises within the City of Elizabethtown, Kentucky was duly filed in the Hardin County Clerk's Office on October 11, 2012, and with the aid and assistance of the Hardin County Clerk, and having reviewed said petition, the County Judge/Executive has determined that the petition sufficiently complies with KRS 242.127 and related statutes, and in accordance with the terms of said petition and KRS Chapters 242.030, 242.040, and 242.060 to 242.120, it is hereby ordered that the Hardin County Clerk and the Hardin County Board of Elections conduct such local option election in accordance with KRS Chapter 242, and related statutes, within the City of Elizabethtown only, on January 8, 2013 and that the Sheriff of Hardin County advertise this order in accordance with KRS Chapter 242 and that the Sheriff post written or printed handbills of this order at not less than five (5) conspicuous places in the Elizabethtown precincts at least two weeks prior to said election.


